In Mrs. McBride's absence, the meeting was called to order by Mr. Lawrence, Secretary of the Board of Trustees. Mr. Castle, Vice President of the Board arrived shortly. The minutes of the Regular Board Meeting on May 20, 2014 of the Board of Trustees of the Midland College District were approved as written.

Receive Presentation by Dr. Ryder Warren, MISD Superintendent

Dr. Warren was proud to report that over 23,000 students completed the academic year. He is grateful for the successful relationship with Early College High School. It is a shining success and it gives these students more opportunities. HB 5 will allow them to partner with new companies for programs with services for our students. There will be a groundbreaking soon for Bunche Elementary and two more elementary schools will be completed by this time next year. MISD is in the process of rezoning the elementary zones and will seek input from the community. Dr. Warren thanked the Board for this opportunity and wished them a safe summer.

Approval of Proposal for Custodial Services

Mr. Bender reported that nineteen Request for Proposals (RFPs) were sent and five vendors responded. GCA received the highest points. A motion was made by Mr. Green to award the bid from GCA, Services Group of Dallas, Texas. Mr. Peeler seconded the motion and the motion was unanimously approved.

Approval of Proposal for Call Manager and Voicemail Equipment

A motion was made by Mr. Lawrence and seconded by Mr. Peeler to approve the bid from Sigma Solutions of Midland, Texas for the purchase of phone and voicemail equipment totaling \$52,539.30. The motion was passed unanimously by all members present.

Approval of Proposal for Painting at Christensen Stadium

Mr. Peeler made a motion to approve the low bid from Dean Hagler, Ltd. of Abilene, Texas for painting services at Christensen Stadium for \$110,538. Painting services will include the fences, buildings, bleachers, awning and bracing at Christensen Stadium. The motion was approved unanimously.

Approval of Proposal for Customized Online Orientation

A motion was made by Ms. Cowden to award the bid to Advantage Design Group of Jacksonville, Florida to produce an online student orientation for \$66,550 which was considered to be the best value. Mr. Florer seconded the motion and the motion was unanimously approved.

Approval of Energy Services Performance Contract

Mr. Geoff Howland, Business Development Manager for Chevron Energy Solutions in Dallas, reported that Phase II will begin immediately with most improvements to be completed by the end of the year and final work wrapped up by October, 2015. Midland College will see more than \$3.6 million in savings over the next 15 years in regards to this agreement. Phase II will include converting indoor lighting to LED bulbs on 23 buildings, applying window film on over 1200 windows, replacing the inefficient chillers at the residence and dining halls, improving temperature controls in three buildings and switching to cloud computing. Also, Midland College will receive an estimated \$75,000 rebate from Oncor because of reduced energy demand. A motion was made by Mr. Green and seconded by Mr. Lawrence to approve the Phase II \$2.8 million contract with Chevron Energy Solutions. The motion was passed unanimously.

Approval of Report from Investment Committee for the Quarter Ended May 31, 2014 Mr. Bender reported on the investment committee's meeting and discussed the changes in the college's investment portfolio. During the quarter ended May 31, 2014 cash and investment balances decreased by a total of \$3,552,254. Current funds decreased by \$3,678,885, endowment funds increased by \$51,586 and debt service funds increased by \$75,045. The decrease in current funds is primarily the result of the college's annual business cycle where revenues are received earlier in the business cycle and expenses are incurred more evenly throughout the year. The decrease included a \$32,174 decrease in the market value of intermediate term securities. The debt service fund increase was due to the collection of taxes pending a scheduled August bond interest payment. The increase in the endowment fund was the result of investment earnings. The portfolio continues to transition away from public fund investment pools and other overnight investments in favor of fixed term investments. As of May 31, 2014, the market value of the investment portfolio totaled \$41,919,485. Of this amount, Cash on hand, bank deposits and short-term (overnight) investments totaled \$11,843,032, Public Fund Investment Pools were \$92,370, FDIC insured Certificates of Deposit were \$13,959,000, Municipal Bonds were \$7,215,410 and U.S. Government and Agency Securities were \$8,809,673. Interest rates continue to be extremely low; however, there have been recent comments by members of the Federal Reserve Board that interest rate changes are being considered. A motion was made by Ms. Cowden to approve the Investment Committee report as presented by Mr. Bender. The motion was seconded by Mr. Lawrence and approved unanimously.

Approval of Preliminary Unrestricted, Auxiliary and Debt Service Budgets for Fiscal Year 2014-15 Mr. Rick Bender presented to the Board a preliminary budget of nearly \$49 million. The budget included \$48.811 million in expenses for the next academic year, a 4.2% increase over last year and \$48,976 million in revenue. Full-time employees, part-time and hourly employees will receive a five percent raise and that includes \$1.158 million in spending. Adjunct and overload courses will receive a three percent increase. The preliminary budget will also include an adjustment to the faculty load policy going from 50 cents an hour for every hour spent in a lab course to 75 cents, an additional \$150,000 in spending. New positions and operating expenses were approved for \$1.5 million. The college anticipates an additional \$1.258 million in property tax revenue and an additional \$328,626 from tuition and fees. Taxable values are expected to increase over \$1 billion for the next fiscal year, up to \$18.9 billion, an increase of 5.96%. The tax rate will remain nearly the same. Maintenance and operations will be 0.11710 per \$100 valuation and debt service will be 0.015696 for a total of 0.13316. Mr. Bender also reported that 44% of the college's revenue comes from local property taxes, while 30% is from student tuition and fees and 17% from the state. A motion was made by Ms. Cowden and seconded by Mr. Florer to approve the preliminary budget as presented by Mr. Bender. The motion was approved unanimously.

Approval of Monthly Comparative Statement of Revenues and Expenses Through the Month of May 2014

A motion was made by Mr. Peeler and seconded by Mr. Lawrence to approve the Comparative Statement of Revenues and Expenses through the month of May, 2014. The motion was unanimously approved by all members present.

As there was no other business to come before the Board, Mr.Castle, declared the meeting adjourned at 5:35 p.m.

It is with deep regret I tender my resignation, effective August 31, 2014. I started at Midland College as an adjunct instructor, worked part-time, and now full-time as the QEP Director and Student Success Program Chair. Most of my time here has been enjoyable, constructive, and productive. After 5 full time years with very good evaluations each year, I have been told I need to look elsewhere for a job. I always thought the institution had the best interests of students at heart. However, the past few months have made it clear to me the institution no longer serves the best interests of students. I have also been subjected to a hostile work environment that I reported in June and received no response. Specifically:

- 1. Under the auspices of a Title V grant, a developmental one semester credit hour course, PREP 1070: Basic Study Skills was created addressing basic study skills for students that fail two or more parts of TSI. Under the QEP a two semester credit hour student success course, EDUC/PSYC 1200: Effective Learning, to address the needs of entering college students was developed. Now the Basic Study Skills is being into a course designed for success in workforce education and Effective Learning is being turned into a basic study skills course. Neither is in the best interests of students. The philosophy of telling developmental students the only option available to them is to go into either workforce certificates or continuing education programs goes against my personal educational philosophy and the philosophy I was hired under at Midland College.
- 2. In spite of the documented success of the student success course, EDUC/PSYC 1200: Effective Learning, the course has been reduced to one hour from two and subjected to scrutiny that no other course at MC has ever been subjected to.
- 3. The teaching credentials of faculty in the program, including my own, have been scrutinized in the name of changes at SACSCOC. Yet, the last time changes were made in the review of credentials through SACSCOC was in 2002 according to SACS VP Marcy Stoll at TCCTA Leading from the Middle. She also said they are not in the process of changing them as several of us have been told.
- 4. I am supposed to report to the Executive Vice President for purposes of the QEP yet the Dean of Adult and Developmental Education has been allowed to make major decisions regarding the course. Numerous instances of conflicting direction from the two supervisors have occurred. I have sought clarification of roles and received none.
- 5. She has tried to impose conditions of employment on me that no other exempt employee is subject to. She has repeatedly treated me in a condescending and even spiteful manner that others have commented on to me after meetings.

SUBJECT: Salary Progression - Faculty/Classified Personnel

I. Faculty

A new faculty member of the College will be paid according to the faculty salary schedule, depending on their educational achievement and experience. To be eligible for the top three levels (MA+30, MA+60, PHD) a majority of the additional hours must be earned in the instructor's major, minor and/or related fields.

Increments are not automatic but depend on the recommendation of the administration based upon the current evaluation system. During times of financial exigency, step progression may be suspended.

II. Classified Personnel

A new employee of the College will normally be placed on "Step" 1 of the appropriate skill level. The employee will progress one (1) "step" on September 1 each year except the first year of employment if hired in June, July, or August. During times of financial exigency, step progression may be suspended.

An employee may be placed on the skill level not to exceed Step 2 when prior experience in work that is directly related to the job for which they are being hired is considered of direct benefit to the College. Such experience must be documented in writing by the hiring supervisor, the experience must be directly related to the job for which they are being hired, and must be justified in light of the experience of all other employees in like jobs. Approval for placing employees above Step 1 on the skill level must be obtained in advance from the President of the College or his designee prior to any commitment to the prospective employee. When an employee reaches the maximum salary in his skill level, this will prevent receipt of an annual salary increase unless an exception is granted by the President.
