IMMUNIZATIONS

According to [Texas law](#), all students are required to have the following immunizations before participating in patient care:

- Hepatitis B (series)
- Measles, Mumps, Rubella – MMR
- Varicella (Chickenpox)
- Tetanus Diphtheria Pertussis – TDAP (expires after 10 years)
- Bacterial Meningitis (if applicable per Texas requirements)

Upload documentation to **CastleBranch** before the application deadline. **Failure to upload proper documentation and ensure all criteria are met will result in an incomplete application that will not be considered for admission.**

SELECTION PROCESS AND POINTS WORKSHEET

SELECTION PROCESS

- **Class Size:** 10–12 students, annually, depending on clinical site availability.
- **Applicants are ranked using the following criteria:**
 1. Total admission points
 2. Cumulative GPA, calculated from all attempts of prerequisite and optional admission courses
 3. Date of application receipt
- Top-ranked applicants will be invited to an **in-person interview** in July (attendance required). *Only the top applicants will be selected for an interview.* Interviews are scored using a standardized rubric to ensure fairness and consistency.

Applicants are evaluated in the following areas:

Final rankings are determined primarily by the average interview score, with secondary consideration given to the applicant's initial rank.

- Admission decisions are emailed by **August 1**.

CLINICAL CLEARANCE

Clinical participation is a required component of all programs. **Once admitted to the program**, ongoing enrollment and progression depend on the successful completion and documentation of the following clinical clearance requirements.

- Current American Heart Association **Basic Life Support (BLS)** certification (maintained for duration of program)
- Criminal Background Check Clearance
- Proof of **health insurance** (maintained for duration of program)
- Annual influenza vaccine
- Tuberculosis screening (or chest X-ray clearance if history of positive test)
- Negative 10-panel drug screen (may be random)
